

VI. Old Business:

A. **Truck Bids:** Highway Superintendent Jim Haggerty read the truck bids.

Kenworth: \$152,543 and they do not have frame extensions.

Peterbilt: \$139,584

Volvo: \$130,950 that includes pump.

International: \$142,477

The Body Companies:

Viking was the cheapest, \$113,534.80, this price would be for the Peterbilt truck, it would go down a couple of grand if you put it on a Volvo.

Valley Fab: Three different bids, one is for the Kenworth with no frame

extensions, there is one for Peterbilt with frame extensions, and one for Volvo as well.

Body for the Volvo \$123,750, that's for the equipment, the stainless steel box, plow, wing, all the hydraulics.

For the Peterbilt it be \$124,000.

For the Kenworth is about \$127,000 yes, they have to mess with the frame

Cyncon: \$133,000 this pricing would also be for the Peterbilt truck.

Jim said it be at least November of next year before the town would be getting this truck. Jim suggested going with the Peterbilt and the Viking. All the trucks are automatic. Supervisor Randy Lester asked what the highway guys think of the Volvo. Jim stated that Terry likes it the other guys don't like it because of the steering. Councilman John Hill ask what truck is the town is replacing. Jim said it would be a Kenworth from 2013. Jim also stated that the way the economy is right now the truck companies will hold the pricing for 20 days. Jim said the warranty on the trucks for most of them are three-year bumper to bumper, and drive train is longer than that.

Total Truck and Body for Peterbilt and Viking is about \$253,000.

The Volvo with the Viking box would be \$243,950.

Dustin Bliss made a motion to order the Volvo truck with the Viking box. Seconded by John Hill.

- B. **Town Green:** Supervisor Randy Lester stated that last year he told the board about a large branch on the tree that is on the town green and it had broken off, the highway department cleaned it up. Randy said couple weeks ago another limb broke off the tree, the highway department came and cleaned it up. There are two branches that or hanging over route 98 and they could possibly break off on the road. Councilman Dustin Bliss ask Highway Superintendent Jim Haggerty if he's got a contact at the state DOT to see about removing the tree, because this tree is in the state DOT's right away. If the state can't take it down at the next board meeting the town board will address it.

The other issue with the town green is determining where the property lines are. Town attorney Eric Firkel said it would be best if the town gets a surveyor. Eric asks if it's a pressing reason to get a survey. Councilman John Hill stated the only problem that the town has is that the property owners on the one side uses the Green as parking and a RV was there until earlier this year and they are using it as their own private property. Also, the property owners have widened their driveway so now they have a driveway twice as wide. Eric asked would you like them to put it back the way it was. John stated that he'd like to see it as this is town property and it's available for everybody's use. The question was asked who is going to do anything there. Randy stated that the senior citizens have done stuff there and a previous board member and deputy historian would like to put a

memorial up for the service people. Councilman Dustin Bliss said let's hire a surveyor and get it done.

John Hill made a motion to have town attorney Eric Firkel get his surveyor to come in and survive this. Seconded by Geoff Milks.

- C. **Horse Manure Law (wanted the rest of the board input):** Councilman Dustin Bliss stated that if at the last meeting the three board members did not do anything with it then he's not going to push the issue.
- D. **Junk Law changes page 1, and page 12 for Board review:** Ron Preivity asked about the size, he does not remember having to give a size other than the first 12 acres he bought. Where does he go with his property to be legal? If he's grandfathered in, he'd like something from the town board in writing. Ron two other question is he doesn't know if he understands the tire rule. Councilman Dustin Bliss stated under section P that if an individual is operating a legal automotive repair shop, they're allowed 300 tires. Ron's next question was does the violation go to the landowner or the tenant? Councilman John hill stated if they don't know who owns the trash then they will give the violation to the landlord, the landlord says it's not their trash then the landlord will give it to the tenant or whoever owns the trash. Ron asked what gives him the right as the landowner to go on the property of his tenants and remove the items. Town Attorney Eric Firkel said you have to have a commercial lease with the person leasing. Ron said he doesn't have a commercial lease it's just a house. Eric said then you have to have a lease with them. The easiest way is for the town to go after the property owner because it would be hard for the town to go after the tenant. Ron stated in most cases you take the citation to the tenant and they'll clean it up, he would have it cleaned up by 28 days of the 30 days. He just wondering because he had other towns send him citations regarding junk. Dustin asked Eric if the town board needs to change the language for the penalties to specifically states the property owner. Councilman Geoff Milk read a piece from the proposed law and it states that unpaid penalties shell be included in the next tax levy against the property. Eric read a section of the law and he stated that it really could be either the tenant or the landlord or both that could be cited. Eric recommended to escalate the penalties he stated that the first penalty should be a \$300, the second one \$500 and then the third one should be \$1000 a day, then any three days they don't fix the violation then it would be a separate offense. John stated the purpose of this law was not to go and make money the purpose of the law was to beautify the town. Ron asked about the size, when this law goes into effect will he have to come down to the town board and tell him the size that he's using for the junkyard. Eric read section 6 (M) regarding the property size and the boundaries. Eric asks the board what do they believe the right away of

communities that wish to control the cumulation of household waste and debris? What does that mean to the board? Eric asked Ron if his junkyard is 500 feet from the property lines. Ron stated that he's got a fence that is 8 feet high, and it is the longest on the closest property line of his property. Eric asked if the board has any complaints about the way Ron is running his business. The board stated no, if they did get a complaint then they would have to investigate. Eric suggested that if his junk yard is generally accepted by everyone in the community and the board, they can dial back some of their restrictions so that his junkyard meets the requirements. Eric questioned it's not licensed junkyard that's the problem, it's junk piles in people yards. The board stated yes. Eric said that he could take some of the towns that he's done this for who had the exact same problems, he will take this law and red lines some of the areas and have an online discussion with the board.

- E. Dog Law, update changes on page 2, this will have to be local law 3 of 2021:** Town Clerk Mindy Holland explained after last board meeting dog control officer Denise Willard, had realized that there was an important sentence missing in section 2, #14 addition C. Because the board had passed it at the last board meeting, it had to be filed with the State. Town Attorney Eric Firkel, stated the cleanest way to do it is to repeal and repass the law that has the addition.

Dustin Bliss made a resolution to have a public hearing at the next scheduled town board meeting at 7:01 to review local 3 of 2021. Seconded by Geoff Milks.

Eric told the board the new title of the law will be called Local Law 3 of 2021, local law licensing, control, confining and leashing of dogs in the Town of Freedom repealing local law 2 of 2021.

- F. American Rescue Plan Act Update:** Supervisor Randy Lester told the board that the town will not get any money that they lost last year. Randy said with this money you must come up with projects, but you will save money in the long run, this will stretch the budgets while you're updating your infrastructure. Councilman John Hill ask if it's supposed to be for in infrastructure, why aren't roads number one. Councilman R. Nick Morgan said that the cameras, the wiring project, the security system would fall under that. Councilman Dustin Bliss asked if it could be used retroactive. Nick stated that this money is good from March, so it should cover the Town. Nick suggested LED lights for the shop, that would be an infrastructure savings. Nick also suggested insulation in the ceiling in the shop. John suggested with the security system, the board transfer the funds from the AARP money into the highway department so they can get a little bit of stuff done on the roads. Dustin doesn't think they can use it on pavement, but he feels

they could use it on sluice pipe, and better shoulders on the roads. Town attorney Eric Firkel said that it's a great idea but in order to get it approved they'd have to hire an engineering firm to put together a report to show how much this is going to save the town. The town board will think about this between now and the next board meeting.

- G. **Dog Census:** The board discussed about the dog Census. There is a lot of unknowns because the last one that was done it was in 2017. Town Clerk Mindy Holland will ask how much the previous person who did the census was paid, how often they do a census and get the information to the board at the next board meeting. It was also mentioned to see if Don Howe would like to do the census again.

Later in the meeting Dog Control Officer Denise Willard received a message from farm and Ag, she stated its not required to do a census. Someone asked if there is a Local Law, or a resolution passed for the town to do census. Mindy would have to look into it, but the Town charges a enumeration fee. When a new dog is enrolled there is a \$5.00 fee added on to the license. Councilman Dustin Bliss asked the board if they would support resin such law if the law exist. Councilman John Hill stated its important that a dog has a license, because then we know the dog is up to date on the Rabies shot.

- H. **Park Fence:** Councilman Dustin Bliss stated that city fence won't come out and look at the job, it's outside of their area, it doesn't fit a certain criteria. Nate Fox and a Fencing company out of Springville, said that neither one of them are interested in looking at it until October. Ron Previty said he will get the board some names of people that might be able to do fencing. The board gave Highway Superintendent Jim Haggerty permission to take the fence down behind the highway building that has no purpose.
- I. **Alcohol Consumption Law, this was brought up at the last meeting a resident would like to open a winery:** Town Attorney Eric Firkel said it's a process and it's done through petition. Eric read the petitions from 1937 that was done in the Town of Freedom, and he also read the one from 1963. Eric then read what was on the ballet in 2017 for Turkey Run, he stated if it was worded differently then the this would be in better shape. Eric stated if it did not say containers of beer, if it just said alcohol beverages, because the winery would have been fine. Eric asked if anyone on the board think there should be any prohibition of selling alcohol. Councilman Dustin Bliss said no how do we undo that. Eric said he can see about getting it on the ballet, and he started in the meantime the board should let her know it will be okay. Eric will look into this to get things rolling.
- J. **Host Community Agreement:** Town Attorney Eric Firkel stated there are better terms then the Town of Freedom has. He feels it be best to start this conversation in an executive session to get advice from the attorney, then open the conversation

up during the open meeting. The board will meet at 6:30 on September 20, 2021 before the next meeting in executive session to discuss this.

- K. Letter to the County regarding the use of hauling milk for the Cheese Plant:** Denise Willard told the board that she looked at a map that has County Route 21 that is Maple Grove Rd to Laidlaw Road, there is a R rated bridge. Its by the old George Farm. Heavy trucks would not be able to pass on this bridge. Denise also stated that a representative from the IDA talked about what's involved in designating a route. If the board would like to talk to someone, they can reach out to Cory Wiktor to answer any question the board may have. Town Attorney Eric Firkel said that the County is opened to taking over some of the town roads, example in the Town of Farmersville, possibly Pigeon Hill. Town Attorney recommend that the board reach out to someone in the DPW, before they send a letter on to the entire legislative. Supervisor Randy Lester had heard that the Town of Farmersville will have 20 years of no taxes, like a PILOT from the County. Councilman R. Nick Morgan said in the paper it stated that they had over 5 million for infrastructure and roads for this project. Nick wrote a letter that the board reviewed. Eric read the letter, and stated it was a great and he would send it to Cory Wiktor.

John Hill made a motion that the Freedom Town Board send the letter to Cory Wiktor. Seconded by R. Nick Morgan.



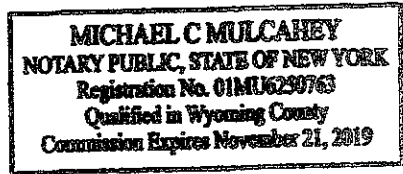

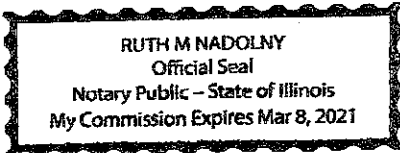
